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To the honorable president of the United States of America, greetings and blessings

I awaited your speech in Cairo with great expectations, and listened to it carefully, with all my heart and soul. It was clear to me that at this venue you, Mr. President, would present an overview of your position and outline the work on the ground. You did so with great clarity.

Your personal beliefs and decisions are yours, however, as the leader of the one remaining super-power, the USA, and the entire free world, I expected you to take into account historical events, belief systems and opinions which have been an integral part of the world since time immemorial.

As a man of faith, you surely know that the source of monotheism is the five books of Moses, the Pentateuch, given to the Jewish People and the entire world at Mt. Sinai. This code of law disseminates the belief that G-d demands all of us to act according to the divine laws laid down in that Torah. It clearly declares that the Land of Israel within its borders is the legacy of the Jewish People given them by G-d Himself. The Creator of all mankind in its world set down the borders of land and sea, and determined that till the end of time, the Land of Israel belongs to the Jewish People. The fact that Israel was expelled and dispersed among the nations does not change the above, for the divine promise in the Books of Moses clearly states that A. He will bring us back to our Land; B. that those nations which seek to harm Israel will be punished for this.

It is amazing that in this chapter of human history, the opportunity afforded you from heaven above to state the truth, meaning the Divine truth, took place in Egypt, where great miracles were once performed to redeem the Children of Israel and the entire world. Pharaoh, the kind of Egypt, was a world leader too: a man of intelligence, a statesman and great rhetorician, while also intrepid and intransigent. In spite of all his power, he brought disaster upon his nation and himself. The book of Exodus, Chapter 15: 4-6 says, **“Pharaoh’s chariots and his host has he thrown into the sea: his chosen captains are also drowned in the Red Sea. The depths have covered them: they sank into the bottom like stone.”**

I have no doubt that a man of erudition such as yourself knows that many powerful nations, no matter how vast their territory, population or influence, have disappeared from the stage of history, and not even one man is left to testify to the fact that he is a descendant of such a lost nation. This was the fate of Egypt, Assyria, Persia and Babylon, and this was the fate of Greece and Rome. If we take the latter as an example, then the only thing left of this enormous empire which ruled over most of Europe, Africa and the entire East are some ruins which tell the story of a great past, but there is no memory of its humanity. The only building which survives whole in

Rome is the world-renowned Titus Arch with its drawing of Jews, artifacts from the Holy Temple, and the eternal, ancient People of Israel.

Your fate as a man and head of a great state will also be determined by G-d, just as He determines the fate of all mankind. It must be clear to you that if you lead the nation at whose head you stand to thwart the Divine will, there must be a price to pay. Your great nation commemorates its founding father and first president George Washington in a famous monument where he holds the hand of the little man who funded the American Revolution, and without whom your homeland would not have become the land of limitless opportunity, where any person can reach high office. That small man whose hand George Washington is holding was a Jew. An America which will participate in usurping land from the Land of the Jews, betrays those who stood beside her in her time of need, meaning her war of independence.

I am sure that from the above you understand that the Land of Israel is not a way station of Jewish refugees, the way you suggested in your Cairo speech, but the fortress of the King and the birthright of the Children of Israel, the Jewish People. I believe that as a man of reason, you know that you cannot draw an analogy between the sufferings of the Jews and that of Arab refugees in this region, as the latter's problems were caused by those who supposedly are their brethren. The lands controlled by the Arabs are endless with tremendous empty spaces suitable for settlement which could serve the Arab refugees as a home for the generations to come to live a productive life. Their plight in no way resembles that of the Jewish People who for 1900 years wandered from exile to exile, a plight moreover, described in the books of the prophets as an interlude from which the world was meant to benefit, learn the Holy Bible, and disseminate its message. How can you believe that the reward for this suffering for the sake of all humanity is the permanent loss of our ancestral lands?

You must also know that there is actually no "Palestinian People." This notion is a mere political, artificial construct. These men and women are a tribal collection of various ancestry and all have roots in other countries. Some are nomadic tribes who can claim no historical connection to this land. The outcome of all the above must be that your own future as a leader and a man hang in the balance. If you act with clarity and determination to preserve the historical legacy of the Jewish People, and allow its growth and expansion, you will harvest great success and go down in history as a unique leader. If you decide otherwise, you and the nation at whose head you stand will disappear from the stage of history. The Jewish People lives and will continue to live for all eternity. You are afforded the historical opportunity to choose between being remembered for all times or sink into being forgotten.

I pray that you will make moral decisions and succeed in carrying them to fruition, for the sake of your nation and all of mankind.
